Literature Review

Due: Oct 8 Weighting: 25%

Write a 1800-2000 word literature review, by widely exploring academic publications (journal articles, book chapters) on the topic of your interest in manga and/or anime studies. Instruction and marking criteria will be provided in iLearn.

Essay Presentation
