Unit description

It is widely acknowledged that manga and anime hold a significant place in contemporary Japanese culture and beyond. This unit provides an insight into the unique visual and linguistic narratives of manga and anime (such as symbolism; conventions; and the specific features and issues of manga/anime creation and circulation). A number of representative works are examined from socio-cultural, psychological, philosophical and literary perspectives. In addition, as the first manga/anime unit, this unit incorporates basic skills training for research and essay writing. This unit is conducted in English and is open to students of any Faculty interested in Japan.

Essay

Due: 20 November

Weighting: 35%

Using appropriate manga/anime examples and scholarly references, analytically discuss one of the essay questions. The questions, instructions and marking criteria will be provided in iLearn.
