Unit description This unit introduces students to the enjoyment of reading Japanese literary works and enhances their understanding of some aspects of Japanese literature from psychological and socio-cultural perspectives. This unit focuses on children's literature, young adult literature, historical novels, detective stories and manga/anime. This unit is conducted in English, although some Japanese materials are used with English translations or explanations.

Analytical Review Presentation

Due: **Week 8**

Weighting: **25%**

The task is for you to present a 7 minute analytical review of a chosen story and its research. Your presentation should be audio recorded and uploaded via VoiceThread. You may complete the task with your partner as a form of a 15 minute debate. You are also required to complete the self assessment. Further details are provided in iLearn.

Essay Presentation

Weighting: **5%**

This task requires you to give a 3-minute presentation on your essay, using two Powerpoint slides. The presentations will be peer-reviewed. Further details are provided in iLearn.
