Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR)

The unit aims at fostering language skills to level B1, described as follows in the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR): Can understand the main points of clear standard input on familiar matters regularly encountered in work, school, leisure, etc. Can deal with most situations likely to arise whilst travelling in an area where the language is spoken. Can produce simple connected text on topics which are familiar or of personal interest. Can describe experiences and events, dreams, hopes and ambitions and briefly give reasons and explanations for opinions and plans.

Unit requirements and expectations

Assignments should be submitted by the due date.

Oral Examination: conducted during the period 1st-10th November, upon the completion of semester 2.

Final Written Examination: Students must pass an examination in order to pass the course. A mark of 50% will be regarded as a pass.

On-campus Session: Held at Macquarie University on Saturday **22nd September** (from 9.30 am – 4.00 pm; Venue: TBA). You are urged to attend if at all possible. The on-campus session will provide a tutorial on grammar, conversation and reading exercises.
