Unit description

In this unit students will study Greek heroes and heroines from antiquity to the present day. They will examine the concept of heroism from its ancient genesis in Greek mythology through to its use in the creation of modern literary and cultural heroes. They will analyse the hero in ancient epic, Classical Greek drama, art and religion, then investigate changing perceptions of heroism in Hellenistic and Byzantine times, including the Christian re-evaluation of heroism, before proceeding to identify and interpret modern ideas of heroism. Students will discover that the concept of the hero is a cultural construct and by studying heroes and heroines across time they will understand something about the cultures in which they were created or recreated.
