This unit is divided in two larger components. One component comprises attendance at 2 Introductory sessions (weeks 1 and 3 of semester 1) run by the Faculty, Department Research Seminars (12 across the entire year) and Departmental Workshops (4 in total) the second component aims to provide students with flexibility to tailor a program that suits their own needs. Each Department, in close collaboration with the Faculty, has developed a set of activities aims to increase each student's knowledge of their topic/s of interest as well as enhance student research skills.

In addition to research seminars and workshops, students options include auditing undergraduate and postgraduate units relevant to their research interests, participate in a reading group, join a research group, and/or attend a range of HDR Learning Skills workshops or Library workshops. Students will have a level of flexibility to develop program that suits their own research needs and maintain a log of their own as part of a transition from being an undergraduate coursework student to becoming a postgraduate researcher.

FOAR7000 is a year long unit.
