Unit description

This unit aims to enable students to become independent users of the Croatian language. It seeks to develop students' skills in reading, writing, comprehension and speaking in Croatian and further develops students' knowledge of contemporary Croatian culture. The unit aims to develop students' language skills towards B1+ level in the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFRL).

Oral Presentation

Assessment Type 1: Quiz/Test Indicative Time on Task 2: 3 hours Due: **18:00-20.00 25/10/2021** Weighting: **20%**

Oral Presentation is to be delivered at the end of each session. It can be done in person (oncampus) or online. Students are required to prepare a 5-7 minute speech on a familiar topic in advance. In the second part of the presentation, students will need to answer several simple questions.

Written Exam

Assessment Type 1: Examination Indicative Time on Task 2: 2 hours Due: **18:00-20.00 01/11/2021** Weighting: **40%**

The written exam is paper-based and has to be taken in Australia. It assesses the content of the whole unit and consists of both closed (e.g. multiple-choice, matching) and open type questions (e.g. filling the gaps, short answer). It also includes reading comprehension and writing section. Only paper dictionaries permitted.

- Identify, evaluate and deploy a broad range of grammatical structures of Croatian at intermediate level.

- develop the ability to understand the main points of clear standard input on familiar matters regularly encountered in work, school, leisure, etc.
- deal with most situations likely to arise while traveling in an area where the language is spoken
- produce simple connected text on topics that are familiar or of personal interest
- describe experiences and events, dreams, hopes, and ambitions and briefly give reasons and explanations for opinions and plans.
