Unit description

This clinical placement unit continues to build knowledge, skills, and competencies from SPTH8832, enabling students to apply them during speech pathology clinical practice. Students will attend placements and engage in clinical service delivery. Students will also engage in case discussions with clients, families and relevant professionals, and further develop advanced communication skills. Placements will provide learning experiences with a range of child and adult communication and swallowing disorders. Students will engage in the preparation, planning, and reflection activities required for clinical placements. Students will attend on campus classes that support their experiential learning. Placement: 13 full days, i.e., 1 day per week for 13 weeks.

Assessment Type 1: Clinical performance evaluation

Students will orally present a clinical case from their SPTH8833 placement. The clinical case will focus on speech pathology intervention. Students will give details about their clinical management of the case, critically review their own management, and discuss the case and their management. Students will address management of a hypothetical case, and self-evaluate their learning during the SPTH8833 placement. This assessment is unweighted.
