Unit description

This is a course-wide capstone unit that is intended to be taken by students in their final session of study. The unit is designed to broaden students' understanding of the importance of strategic business matters in the areas of an organisation's planning, operations, leadership, ethics and broader sustainability, economic and global developments. Through the unit's real world experience opportunities and engagement in business challenges requiring cross-disciplinary insights and knowledge, students are not only required to develop their reflective and integrative thinking but also engage in the development of their future-focused, strategic thinking. Students are exposed to contemporaneous business intelligence devised to give them the opportunity to consider practical implications of business issues and challenges and to investigate strategic business matters within the context of a business environment. Students work in self-managing teams to prepare group reports, complete practice-based tasks and conduct a session long research-based project.

You will work as part of a multi-disciplinary team to develop an innovative product, program, or initiative that helps an organisation contribute to achieving the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (UN SDGs). **Skills in focus:** - Critical Thinking and Problem Solving - Written and Verbal Communication - Application of Discipline Knowledge - Teamwork - Work Readiness - Ethical Thinking **Deliverable:** Group Report [max 3000 words, 25%, assessed as a group] and Group Video Presentation [4 minutes per member, 20%, assessed individually] Individual and Group assessment
