Unit description

This unit provides a practical introduction to investigation and design techniques in geotechnical and transport engineering. The projects are defined in consultation with engineers from practice, and students are expected to carry out the project emulating equivalent industry project-based professional practice. During the project, students will engage in teamwork, and will be required to investigate several options in a multi-objective context. The project work will draw upon knowledge and skills primarily gained in CIVL2205 Geotechnical Engineering, and CIVL3201 Transport Engineering, as well as other foundational knowledge.

Learning in this unit enhances student understanding of global challenges identified by the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (UNSDGs) Industry, Innovation and Infrastructure; Sustainable Cities and Communities
